Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, Holy Ground, is a praise song written in 1983. It is included in our current hymnal, stating: "We are standing on holy ground, and I know that there are angels all around; let us praise Jesus now; we are standing in His presence on holy ground." It reminds us that, as we gather to worship, God is in our midst.

The Word in Music, Put Your Hand in the Hand, is a gospel pop song written in 1970 by Canadian Gene MacLellan. It was recorded extensively by various artists, including Elvis Presley, Joan Baez, and Loretta Lynn. I love the mental picture that MacLellan drew with the lyrics. The first verse says, "Put your hand in the hand of the man who stilled the water; put your hand in the hand of the man who calmed the sea. Take a look at yourself and you can look at others differently; put your hand in the hand of the man from Galilee."

I Was There to Hear Your Borning Cry, the hymn after the sermon, is a fairly recent hymn (1985.) The composer, John Ylvisaker, says that he wrote the lyrics with the thought in mind that it is a love song from God to us – and that it gives a sense of the timelessness of God.

The text for the offertory piece, Purify My Heart, is taken from 2 Corinthians 7:1: Since we have these promises, dear friends, let us purify ourselves from everything that contaminates body and spirit, perfecting holiness out reverence for God. This is a piece that our congregation has sung in the past. It is a song of prayer and reflection that was written in 1993. The words to the chorus are: "Purify my heart, touch me with Your cleansing fire; take me to the cross, Your holiness is my desire. Breathe Your life in me, kindle a love that flows from Your throne. Oh purify my heart, purify my heart."
