

Worship Music this Week

The prelude for this Transfiguration Sunday (and the closing hymn), *Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise*, is based on I Timothy 1:17: "Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen." Walter Smith wrote the lyrics in 1867 to a traditional Welsh tune, *St. Denio*. The opening verse reads – "Immortal, invisible, God only wise; In light inaccessible hid from our eyes; most blessed, most glorious, the Ancient of Days; Almighty, victorious, Thy great Name we praise." The lyrics remind us of the awe and reverence that we have as we worship His glory is hidden from our eyes. Isaiah 6:2 tells us that the angels cover their faces in God's presence, because they cannot look on God's full glory.

The Word in Music, *Behold He Comes*, is an up-tempo medley of three songs: *Days of Elijah*, *Hallelujah! What a Savior*, and *It is Well with My Soul*. I particularly like part of the text in Days of Elijah – "Behold He Comes, riding on a cloud, shining like the sun, at the trumpet's call . . ." for this day.

The music for communion is two different arrangements of *Lead Kindly Light*. The text for the old hymn was written by John Newman in 1833, the music composed by John Dykes in 1865. The hymn is meant to be a prayer, a petition, a thanksgiving, and a submission to love and trust in Him. The lyricist, John Newman, sincerely asks God to lead him in the midst of an uncertain, frail, and tumultuous life. Each of us at times during our lives asks God to "Lead, kindly, light. Lead thou me on." The language of the hymn text is clearly ancient. The first verse: "Lead, kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom, lead Thou me on! The night is dark, and I am far from home; lead Thou me on! Keep Thou my feet; I do not ask to see the distant scene; one step enough for me."
