#### **Additions to the Brown Property**

Two Eagle Scout projects on the Brown property were recently completed and are available for use by anyone in the church family.

First, a prayer labyrinth was constructed next to the outdoor chapel. A prayer labyrinth is a circuitous path (not a maze) used to facilitate prayer, meditation, spiritual transformation, and/or global unity. As one moves toward the center of the labyrinth the person focuses on letting go of worldly attachments or coming to God with a question.

At the center, the person comes to the center of his or her relationship with God. One may linger in the center of the labyrinth, spending time reflecting on one's relationship with God and praying. Eventually, however, the need returns to move out into the world again. As the pilgrim leaves, she or he walks with Jesus back into places of ministry as a renewed person. The labyrinth is open for use at any time and we encourage you to make your way there anytime you are in need of quiet, meditative reflection and prayer.

Second, a grill station was constructed to house our grill. It includes a large, granite counter for food prep and service. If you would like to use the grill for your church event please contact the church office to reserve it.
