**Worship Music this Week** 

Swing Low, Sweet Chariot, the prelude, is a well-known spiritual. But music historians say Sweet Chariot was actually a code slaves used to communicate about escaping to Canada. Some slaves would change the lyrics to Swing Low, Sweet Harriet, a reference to Harriet Tubman, leader of the Underground Railroad. "They learned to use this medium to get what they wanted," says J. Weldon Norris, professor of music history at Howard University. The chorus and first verse of the song say: "Swing low, sweet chariot, coming for to carry me home. I looked over Jordan, and what did I see? Coming for to carry me home. I saw a band of angels coming after me, coming for to carry me home."

The Word in Music, *Draw Me Nearer*, is in a bluesy gospel style by arranger Jack Schrader. The actual name of the hymn is *I Am Thine*, *O Lord* – words by Fanny Crosby, music by William Doane. In 1874 Crosby was a visitor in Doane's home in Cincinnati. While they were talking, they discussed the nearness of God in their lives. As Crosby thought about their conversation late in the evening, she formed the words for the hymn. The next day she shared the words with Doan, who wrote down the stanzas and composed the tune. The hymn is written in the first person and is a testimony to her relationship with Christ. It is said that Hebrews 10:22 was actually the source of Crosby's inspiration, which says: *Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water.* 

The offertory 4-hand piano duet, Soon and Very Soon, is a spirited gospel song written by Andraé Crouch in 1978. It is based on Revelation 21:3-4: And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

The closing hymn, O Master Let Me Walk with Thee, was written by Washington Gladden in 1879. The hymn is a prayer that expresses what all of us feel - a need to walk with God, to feel His presence, and to have Him guide us.
