#### Worship Music this Week:

The opening hymn, *Christ Has Risen While Earth Slumbers* is a fairly new hymn, written in 1998 by John Bell, a hymn writer and Church of Scotland minister, and Graham Maule. Bell is a member of the Iona Community, a dispersed Christian ecumenical group that works for peace and social justice, rebuilding of community and the renewal of worship. The hymn text begins with conventional Easter imagery, then moves into unexpected territory by declaring that Christ's Resurrection is for "all whose lives are messed or mangled, all who find religion strange." The name of this traditional Welsh melody means "lullaby."

The Word in Music, *My Redeemer's Love*, is an Eastertide anthem that begins and ends with a choral fanfare and incorporates the congregation using a resurrection text. The tune, *Hyfrydol*, is very familiar to us. The melody is used as the tune in an Advent hymn, *Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus*, an Easter hymn, *Alleluia! Sing to Jesus*, and in *Love Divine, All Loves Excelling*.

The offertory piece, *There Is a Redeemer*, was a combined effort composed by Melody and Steve Green (he wrote one verse.) Its message is straightforward – Jesus is God's gift to the world, and He left the Spirit to continue what the Son started. The words of the first verse and refrain: *There is a redeemer, Jesus, God's own Son, Precious Lamb of God, Messiah, Holy One. Jesus my redeemer, Name above all names, Precious Lamb of God, Messiah, Hope for sinners slain. Thank you oh my father, for giving us Your Son, and sending Your Spirit, 'til the work on Earth is done.*
