Worship Music this Week:

Today's Word in Music is the third in a series of "Jesus" anthems leading up to the cantata (title: Jesus! The Advent of the Messiah). The first anthem, on Christ the King Sunday, was Jesus, Only Jesus, the second, last Sunday, was Come, Thou Jesu.

The accompaniment for the Word in Music this week, *Come, Lord Jesus, Dwell Among Us,* is from Bach's Cantata No. 140, written in 1731. The text for the anthem is from Charles Wesley's *Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus*, written in 1744. Arranger Lloyd Larson has added an original tune and a few of his own words to the piece.

The hymn after the sermon today, *Prepare the Way, O Zion*, is based on a message from Matthew 3: 1-3 by John the Baptist. God sent him to set the stage for the coming of Jesus as the savior of the world (long after God declared: I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness...) The reading from His word: In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah, saying: "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; Make His paths straight."

It was John who told of the One to come, the Messiah, the One who would send the Holy Spirit to those he baptized.
