Worship Music this Week:

The words for the prelude piece, *Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus*, were written for Advent by Charles Wesley in 1744. The tune (with words) will also be heard during the Word in Music today. The organ arrangement by Mark Kellner is a playful, dance-like arrangement of the hymn tune Hyfrydol.

The opening hymn, *Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates*, is an Advent hymn written in 1642 by Georg Weissel, a German scholar, teacher and pastor, who took inspiration

from the words of King David in Psalm 24. We rejoice through this hymn because of His arrival into our world in the person of Jesus.

The Word in Music, Come, Thou Jesu, pairs Bach's Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring with the Advent tune and text of Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus. The arranger has written new words in some portions (but keeping the "traditional" words in most of the piece); however, the melodies are well-known. The anthem has the quality of a petition - a prayer that implores Christ to be among us.
