Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, *O Come*, *O Come Emmanuel* is ancient, not only in its text, but also in its music. The tune we use today was finalized in the 1800s, though the text was written during the 12th century. The haunting modal melody for the verses is also of ancient origin. It is based on one of the earliest forms of sacred music known as the chant or plainsong, which was the type of music used in the church during medieval times. The lack of strict rhythmic measures gives the tune, *Veni Emmanuel*, a free-flowing style. The hymn highlights the name Emmanuel for Jesus and invites Him to come and redeem us.

The opening hymn, *Prepare the Way, O Zion*, was written by Swede Frans Mikael Frazen in 1812. It is a lilting Advent hymn based on Isiah 40: 3 – A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God." The carol has been sung in the Church of Sweden for nearly 200 years.

The Word in Music is *Every Valley*, an original work by Joseph Martin. Set in a classical style, the instrumental introduction is the ancient carol, *Low, How a Rose 'Ere Blooming*. The incorporation of *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* within the arrangement is the plea of Christians for thousands of years before Christ was born that continues for us today as we wait for His return. It is based on the familiar text from Isaiah 40.

The hymn after the sermon, *Blest Be the God of Israel*, is a 20th-century paraphrase of the Song of Zechariah from Luke 1: 68-79.

The tune for *Greensleeves*, the music during communion, is a traditional English ballad written by an unknown composer that can be traced back as far as the 1500s. We use the tune for the Christmas carol *What Child Is This*.
