Worship Music this Week:

The prelude for this Transfiguration Sunday is The Light of the World Is Jesus. The composer, Philip Bliss (born in northern Pennsylvania), was known as the "singing pilgrim." He wrote many hymns that were used at revivals in England and Scotland. The first verse and refrain state: "The whole world was lost in the darkness of sin, the Light of the world is Jesus! Like sunshine at noonday, His glory shone in; The Light of the world is Jesus! Come to the light, 'tis shining for thee; sweetly the light has dawned upon me; once I was blind, but now I can see: The Light of the world is Jesus!"

The Word in Music, This Is My Beloved Son, is an account of the transfiguration, from Matthew 17: 1-8.

Be Thou My Vision, the offertory piece, is an ancient Irish poem that was translated into English by Mary Byrne in 1905. The tune is an Irish ballad that comes from the 7th or 8th century.

The closing hymn, Lord, the Light of Your Love Is Shining (Shine, Jesus, Shine), was written in 1987 by Graham Kendrick, the son of a Baptist pastor, who trained as a teacher but became a singer/songwriter in 1972. He used the same text referenced in the prelude, John 8:12. In one interview, Kendrick said, "This song is a prayer for revival. A songwriter can give people words to voice something which is already in their hearts but which they don't have the words or the tune to express, and I think Shine Jesus Shine caught a moment when people were beginning to believe once again that an impact could be made on a whole nation." Our hymnal says the hymn "is perhaps best understood as a response to the Transfiguration."
