Worship Music this Week:

The choral anthems that will be sung by the Trinity Choir during this season of Lent will focus on the love of God. The anthem today, God So Loved, is an arrangement that includes two compositions that you will hear instrumentally, as well as in word.

The arranger for the World in Music, John Purifoy, takes snippets of John Stainer's God So Loved the World from his oratorio The Crucifixion: A Meditation on the Sacred Passion of the Holy Redeemer, beginning and ending the anthem with the words and music that he composed in 1887. The majority of the arrangement is the hymn composed by Frederick Lehman in 1917.

The offertory is a piano version of the hymn. Some of the words are, "The love of God is greater far than tongue or pen can ever tell; it goes beyond the highest star, and reaches to the lowest hell; the guilty pair, bowed down with care, God gave His Son to win; His erring child He reconciled, and pardoned from his sin."

Please take the time to read the footnotes for hymn #165 The Glory of These Forty Days in our hymnal. Note in particular that the words were written in the 16th century, and notice the names that are included in the text of the hymn.
