Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, *Kum Ba Yah*, is an African-American spiritual (circa 1920.) The organ arrangement today goes through three of the many verses that have been sung over the years. The first verse (and the basis for the whole song) says: "Kum ba yah, my Lord, kum ba yah; Kum ba yah, my Lord, kum ba yah; Kum ba yah, my Lord, kum ba yah, means "come by here" – an appeal to God for help.

The text and music for the choral arrangement of *Come to the Table of Grace*, the Word in Music, were written in 2007. The refrain from the anthem is "Come to the table of grace, join us as we celebrate; the call of salvation is your invitation to come. Come to the table of grace."

The refrain for the hymn *Bread of Life from Heaven* was written by Reverend Susan Briehl in 2001 (stanzas by Marty Haugen), Executive Director of Holden Village, a Lutheran center for renewal in the North Cascade Mountains in Washington State. The tune is Argentine Santo. John 6:35 says: *And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.*


