Worship Music This Week

The prelude is an arrangement by Ken Medema, who has been writing choral and piano music for decades. The arrangement for the prelude is an interesting composition that begins with Bach's *Sheep May Safely Graze* (that appears throughout the piece) and moves to *You Are My All in All*, with a slight twist. Medema slightly delays a note in the melody of the main theme.

The offering by the Bells of Joy this morning is based on Ephesians 5:8: "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light." The words were written by Kathleen Tomerson in 1970. The opening phrase: *I want to walk as a child of the light; I want to follow Jesus. God set the stars to give light to the world; the star of my life is Jesus.*

The Word in Music, *You Are My All in All/Fairest Lord Jesus* is a "blended" anthem. It combines a praise song that was written by Dennis Jernigan in 1991 with a beloved "traditional" hymn. This anthem is the last in a series of "Jesus" anthems that have a message of all that Jesus is to us and our belief in Him. *You Are My All in All* is a song of praise for who Christ is and what He does. It was written as a personal prayer to Him that describes situations and attributes, all of which conclude with the proclamation, *You are my all in all*. The anthem says He is: Our strength in weakness and the treasure that we seek; aprecious jewel that we would be foolish to give up; the forgiver of our sin and shame (and we will bless His name); and that He will pick us up when we fall. The refrain says: *Jesus, Lamb of God, worthy in your name...*

The words for one part of the postlude, Oh Lord, Oh Lord, You're Beautiful, continue the idea of what He is: Oh Lord, You're beautiful. Your face is all I seek; for when Your eyes are on this child, Your grace abounds to me.
