Worship Music this Week

The text for the prelude, Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross, was written by Fanny Crosby in 1869. It is based on Hebrews 12:2 – "fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." She penned the text to a tune written by William Doane, which she said reminded her of the cross and its importance in the lives of Christians.

The anthem, Near the Cross/The Power of the Cross, blends the classic hymn Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross (a different arrangement of the prelude), with Keith Getty and Stuart Townend's contemporary song The Power of the Cross creating a wonderful Lenten choral piece. The end of the anthem states, "We stand forgiven at the cross." The anthems offered by the Trinity Choir during Lent share the same theme of "the Cross".

The postlude, There Is Power in the Blood, is a gospel hymn written by Lewis Jones in 1899. The refrain says, "There is power, power, wonder working power in the blood of the Lamb; there is power, power, wonder working power in the precious blood of the Lamb."
