Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, He's Always Been Faithful, is a praise song composed by Sara Groves. The arrangement you will hear this morning incorporates the beloved hymn Great Is Thy Faithfulness, written in 1923 by Thomas Chisholm. The first verse of Sara's song says: Great is thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me; Morning by morning I wake up to find the power and comfort of God's hand in mine; season by season I watch Him, amazed, in awe of the mystery of His perfect ways; all I have need of, His hand will provide, He's always been faithful to me.

The Word in Music, You Are Here, is the first of a series of anthems that talk about all that Jesus is to us and our belief in Him. This anthem speaks of how He is strong when we are weak, and that He always wraps us in His tender care. The chorus after each verse statement says, You love me, Lord, when I'm not worthy. You love me, Lord, when I have strayed. Yet You call on me to end my fear. You are here. You are here!

The offertory, You Are My Hiding Place, is taken from Psalm 32: 7. It was written by Michael Ledner in 1981 when he was 27 years old and going through a painful period in his life. He shared the song with friends who were serving at a communal settlement in Israel. Those people took the song with them when they returned to California. In time, Maranatha Music contacted Mr. Ledner to ask him to record his song.

The hymn after the sermon, *Blest Are They*, is a paraphrase of the Beatitudes (Matthew 5: 1-12), which was the opening statement of Christ's Sermon on the Mount.

The postlude, *Rigaudon*, is one of many compositions with the same title. The term was applied to music with a lively tempo in the 17th/18th centuries in France.

Rebuilding Together Howard County Saturday, April 29th

Rebuilding Together Howard County (RTHC) is a non-profit organization dedicated to helping Low Income Homeowners make their homes Safe, Warm, and Dry. Repairs are made to the homes at no cost to the homeowners. CMPC's relationship with RTHC began in February 2014. CMPC volunteers repaired homes in April 2014, April 2015, and April 2016.

There will be opportunity for two builds this year. The first build will be the last weekend in April (Saturday, April 29, 2017) and again in the fall (date TBD).

Volunteers are needed for April 29, 2017. No experience required. Volunteers must be at least age 14. We need a snack/drink coordinator as well as workers. Information will be posted on the Mission Bulletin Board.



In the fall of 2015, the Mission and Local Outreach Committee went through a process of discernment that led the members to conclude that CMPC should initiate a long term relationship with a missionary in the field. Research that was part of the discernment led the committee to the Rev. Michael Weller and his wife Rachel.



Michael and Rachel Weller were appointed in 1994 to serve in Ethiopia with the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus (EECMY). Michael is the PC(USA)'s regional liaison for the Horn of Africa, where the PC(USA) works with partner churches in Sudan, South Sudan and Ethiopia. Rachel is health coordinator for the East and West Gambella Bethel Synods of the EECMY in western Ethiopia.

Rachel's work with three medical clinics in one of the most remote parts of Ethiopia offers her many challenges, the largest of which is finding well-trained medical staff willing to live and work there. She is encouraged by the commitment of the East and West Gambella Bethel Synods to overcoming these obstacles so that the people of the area may have access to health care.
