### **Worship Music This Week**

As you listen to the prelude, Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem, picture the first Palm Sunday. As Jesus entered Jerusalem riding on a donkey, hopeful crowds filled the streets waving palm branches and praising God. It was a regal and joyful procession!

The hand bell piece is an arrangement of All Glory, Laud and Honor, a hymn written during the early Middle Ages by St. Theodulph as a Palm Sunday procession. The postlude is an arrangement of the same tune.

During the opening hymn, Hosanna, Loud Hosanna, the choir enters section by section, each repeating a different phrase from Luke 19: 38-40, creating a musical representation of the clamor of the crowd on that day. The congregation will sing the hymn after the opening sentences. During that time, the children of the congregation will walk through the aisles waving palm branches.

The Word in Music, Just Beyond the Palms, mingles the bitter and the sweet of Palm Sunday together. The setting has the listener standing at the crossroads of the triumph of Christ's entry into Jerusalem, and also looking past the cheering crowds to the jeering mob of Good Friday, as it states: "Is this the Messiah? Where is His crown? Is this the One? The question resounds! Is this the Savior? Where is His robe? Is this the King that was foretold?"

Hosanna (Praise Is Rising), the piece for the offertory, was written by Brenton Brown and Paul Baloche in 2005. As we go into Holy Week, the words are very fitting, which say in part: "Praise is rising, eyes are turning to You, we turn to You; Hope is stirring, hearts are yearning for You, we long for You. When we see You, we find strength to face the day; In Your presence all our fears are washed away. Hosanna, hosanna, You are the God who saves us, worthy of all our praises. Hosanna, hosanna, come have Your way among us, we welcome You here Lord Jesus."

Bright and early on Easter Sunday morning we will gather to worship the Risen Son as the sun rises. All are welcome to join in this simple and powerful worship experience. The service will be moved indoors in the event of inclement weather. Light refreshments
