#### Worship Music This Week

The prelude, *I Could Sing of Your Love Forever*, was written by vocalist Martin Smith of the Christian band Delirious in 1994. He said the words came to him when he was sitting on a hillside on a sunny afternoon. The opening text is: *Over the mountains and the sea*, *Your river runs with love for me; And I will open up my heart, and let the Healer set me free. I'm happy to be in the truth, and I will daily lift my hands, for I will always sing of; Of when Your love came down. I could sing of Your love forever....* 

All of the choral anthems during Lent have messages about mercy. The text for the Word in Music today, *Wonderful, Merciful Savior*, shares the many ways our Lord is with us at all times. It was written in 2001 (recorded by Selah in 2002). The first verse and refrain say: *Wonderful merciful Savior*, *Precious redeemer and friend*. *Who would have thought that a lamb could rescue the souls of men*, *Oh You rescue the souls of men*. *You are the One that we praise*. *You are the One we adore*. *You give the healing and grace our hearts always hunger for*.

The hymn after the sermon, *I Need Thee Every Hour*, was written by Annie Sherwood Hawks in 1872. In her own words, she says of the hymn "One day as a young wife and mother of 37 years of age, I was busy with my regular household tasks during a bright June morning. Suddenly, I became so filled with the sense of nearness to the Master that, wondering how one could live without Him, either in joy or pain, these words were ushered into my mind, the thought at once taking full possession of me – "*I Need Thee Every Hour*..." Her pastor, Dr. Robert Lowry, wrote the music and the refrain to her poem of praise.
