Worship Music this Week

I Will Rise, the Word in Music, was written by Chris Tomlin in collaboration with pastor Louie Giglio in 2011. It is an anthem that has a message for Eastertide - as we know He is risen! Tomlin says this about how the song came together: "We were sitting across a table at lunch one day and he (Giglio) said, 'Man, I feel like there needs to be more songs for people who are really going through the hardest time in life. They're struggling and maybe have just buried someone and they're looking over a grave. And that sense of loss, that hurt of loss of losing someone. But what kind of words can you give people in that moment in worship, to worship God in the midst of it?' And that song specifically speaks to that. I wrote down a little line that he said, 'the grave is overwhelmed.' That's the line that he was carrying. I took that one line, 'The grave is overwhelmed,' and built the song around it. So, 'Jesus has overcome/And the grave is overwhelmed/Victory is won/He's risen from the dead.' And that became a song of real hope for people who lose someone and know that this is not the end. That this life, the physical flesh is not the end, but God has given us life everlasting spirit, that's our hope."

The solo for communion, *I Will Boast*, was composed by Chris Tomlin and Jason Ingram. Tomlin included it in his *Love Ran Red* album in 2014. Reviewer Nelson Russia wrote of the piece, which is one of the quieter moments of the album, "Tomlin vividly takes us back to 'the cross where my Savior died for me,' reminding us of the unsurpassed strength and depth of Jesus's love, the 'scars of love and scars that heal,' that 'broke the curse and set me free.' With Tomlin declaring that 'I will boast only in the cross,' the song is filled with much adoration for Christ and thanksgiving for the freedom and forgiveness that we have been granted because 'Only One took the nails, Only one tore the veil, Only One spotless Lamb."
