CMPC's Mission Committee is funding a portion of the effort, and we are hoping to raise the balance of funds through donations. The meals are shipped throughout the world to support school feeding programs, orphanages, and crisis relief. The food is stored easily, transported guickly, and has a shelf-life of two years.

Worship Music this Week

The opening hymn, How Lovely, Lord, was written in 1984 by Presbyterian pastor Arlo Duba. It is a paraphrase on Psalm 84. He named it *Merle's Tune*, after his sister, who was his first piano teacher.

The Word in Music, Fairest Lord Jesus (You Are Beautiful to Me), arranged by Heather Sorenson, envelopes two tunes for the beloved hymn - Crusader's Hymn and a traditional Irish folk melody. The words and the tune are familiar; however, Sorenson made the more familiar tune very syncopated. In between the two "fairest" tunes is an original song, You Are Beautiful to Me, that says, "You are beautiful to me. Your glory fills the sky. And the wonder of Your love brings me to my knees, yet helps me stand." It is a song of love to the Savior of mankind!

The closing hymn, What a Friend We Have in Jesus, is a beloved hymn that reminds us of the assurance of Christ's presence in our lives - "Take it to the Lord in Prayer."

The postlude is a piano arrangement of Jesus Shall Reign Where'er the Sun. The text was written by Isaac Watts in 1719. The final verse says, "Let every creature rise and bring honors peculiar to our King; angels descend with songs again, and earth repeat the loud Amen!"
