Worship Music this Week:

The prelude is a combination of two songs arranged by composer/arranger Ken Medema that are similar in thought – that with God's arms beneath us and His love surrounding us, we can find strength in every circumstance that comes our way. The music was written by Anthony Showalter, a teacher, in 1887 when he received two letters from former students, both saying their wives had died – on the same day. As Showalter sat down to write letters of sympathy and condolence, the words to *Leaning on the Everlasting Arms* began to come into his thoughts. For the lyrics to the hymn please see #837 in the hymnal.

The second part of the arrangement, O Rest in the Lord, is from Felix Mendelssohn's Elijah. The text: "O rest in the Lord, wait patiently for Him, and He shall give thee thy heart's desires. Commit thy way unto Him, and trust in Him, and fret not thyself because of evil doers."

The Word in Music, I'll Fly Away, was written in 1929 by Albert Brumley. The arrangement offered during worship today is a dynamic arrangement that includes SATB choir and 4-hand piano accompaniment. The words for the chorus: "I'll fly away, fly away, Oh Glory, I'll fly away; When I die, Hallelujah, by and by, I'll fly away."

The piece for the offertory, Marching to Zion, is an arrangement of a hymn (Come, We That Love the Lord) written by Isaac Watts in 1707 (refrain by Robert Lowry.) Through the text, Watts hoped to communicate the joy of what was to come through eternal life in heaven. Some of the words are: (V1) "Come, we that love the Lord, and let our joys be known; join in a song with sweet accord, join in a song with sweet accord, and thus surround the throne, and thus surround the throne." (V2) "There we shall see His face, and never, never sin. There, from the rivers of His grace; there, from the rivers of His grace; drink endless pleasures in, drink endless pleasures in." (V3) "Then let our songs abound, and every tear be dry; we're marching through Immanuel's ground, we're marching through Immanuel's ground, to fairer worlds on high." Refrain: "We're marching to Zion, beautiful, beautiful Zion; we're marching upward to Zion, the beautiful city of God."


