Worship Music this Week:

The prelude for Reformation Sunday is an interesting arrangement of Martin Luther's great reformation hymn, A Mighty Fortress Is Our God. The arranger provides settings in various styles - stately, bouncy, and at the end of the piece an incomplete statement of the melody that is very bold and broad.

We will also sing the hymn during worship. It has been called the "Battle Hymn of the Reformation" for the effect it had in increasing support for Reformers' causes. After Luther posted his ninety-five theses on the door of Wittenberg's Castle Church in October 1517, he faced several years of trials and persecution. During the years of the Protestant Reformation, he came to know the loving power of God's presence. Then, with confidence, he stepped forward to defend the truth he found in God's Word, despite excommunication, continual threats to his life and freedom, and times of intense spiritual battle. Luther found comforting words and inspiration for the hymn in Psalm 46, which begins: God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging.

The Word in Music, Only God, is a stately and dramatic original anthem composed for Reformation Sunday by Mary McDonald. The text reminds us that God is the master of the mountains and the sea, and is also the only one who can truly heal the human heart.

During the offertory, the Trinity Choir will sing the anthem All That I Am, which was sung at Scott's installation service five years ago. The words that are repeated a few times during the piece are: "All that I am, all I can be, all that I have, all that is me, accept and use, Lord, as you would choose, Lord, right now, today. Take every passion, every skill, take all my dreams and bend them to Your will. My all I give, Lord, for you I'll live, Lord, come what may."

The words for the postlude, I Sing the Mighty Power of God, were written by Isaac Watts in 1715. The hymn speaks of God making mountains rise, spreading the flowing seas abroad, and building the lofty skies. It tells of a sun that rules the day, and a moon that shines at God's command, and stars that obey Him. Watts hoped that by singing the words, people would come to understand something of God's creation, His providence, and His love.
