Worship Music this Week:

The Word in Music, *Stand Up!*, is a rousing collection of six classic gospel hymns that have the word "stand" in the title: *Stand by Me, Standing on the Promises, I Stand Amazed in the Presence, Standing in the Need of Prayer, Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus, and The Solid Rock ("on Christ the solid Rock I stand")* arranged by Joel Raney, a Chicago-based conductor, composer, arranger, and editor who works for Hope Publishing Company. The prelude, *Standing on the Promises,* and the postlude, *Stand Up for Jesus!*, are in keeping with the gospel theme of the anthem.

The offertory duet, *O For a Thousand Tongues (to Sing)*, was composed by Charles Wesley for the one-year anniversary of his renewal of faith. He wrote it as an 18-stanza poem, originally titled "For the Anniversary Day of One's Conversion." The words that are used today as the opening stanza began as the seventh verse of the poem. Charles and his brother John were meeting with German Moravians, who loved to sing. The poem was born when one of the leaders said, "Had I a thousand tongues I would praise Jesus Christ with them all!" Amen!!


