Worship Music this Week:

The Word in Music, *Come, Now Is the Time to Worship*, pairs a classic worship song with an original setting of Psalm 100 by the arranger, Larry Shackley, stating, "Come, make a joyful noise to God on high, and sing for joy. Shout and clap your hands! Come before Him, all you nations. Now let the people rejoice and praise His name, for He is good, and His goodness endures. He will bless His people when they come."

Brian Doerksen, the composer of *Come, Now Is the Time to Worship*, is a Canadian singer/songwriter and worship leader. He wrote this song in 1998. Other songs he has composed are *Refiner's Fire, Faithful One* and *Hope of the Nations*. The words to the praise song are: "Come now is the time to worship; Come now is the time to give your heart. Come just as you are to worship; Come just as you are before your God. Come. One day every tongue will confess You are God, One day every knee will bow. Still the greatest treasure remains for those who gladly choose You now."

The piece for the offertory, *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*, is a beautiful, sensitively-written arrangement by Mary McDonald of Joseph Scriven's poem, written to his mother in 1855. He was an Irish-born immigrant living in Canada, and was unable to travel to Ireland to visit her when she was ill. Years later when he himself was ailing, he scribbled the words on scratch paper near his bed. A friend asked him if he had written the words. His response: "The Lord and I did it between us." Charles Converse wrote music to the poem in 1868. This hymn has always been special to me. Today it is offered on what would have been my father's 100th birthday. It was one of his favorite hymns. I will always thank our Lord for the special person that my dad, Milton James Carlson, was and for the deep and abiding faith that he passed on to his family!
