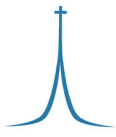

The Columbia Jazz Band Concert, Saturday, November 15, 2014



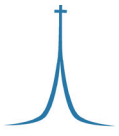

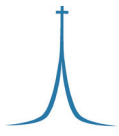

This is time of year when we celebrate anew the incredible gift we received when He became flesh and dwelt among us. There is glorious music written for the Advent and Christmas season!

On December 7th, the Word in Music is *Prepare!* by Joseph Martin. The underlying words from the men during the anthem say over and over again, "Prepare ye the way . . ." It is pure Advent in pleading for the Savior to come from beginning to end.

The Christmas cantata, *Season of Wonders*, will be sung on December 14th. This is an extraordinary work filled with classic carols as well as newly composed anthems that shines new light upon the miracles surrounding the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. You will be as blessed by hearing this beautiful music as we have been in preparing it. A small orchestra, along with Lorri, will accompany this beautiful composition.

The Word in Music on December 21st, *Advent Jubilate!* speaks to the dual theme of the birth and coming again of our Lord. May He awaken in your heart again the wonder of Christmas!

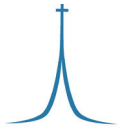

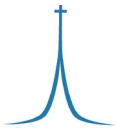

An Update From Our Property Manager

The weather is changing outside and the property committee remains busy ensuring we are safe and warm inside. The heating system was checked, tuned, and later tuned again in some parts of the church and now is on and working well. We also are doing what we can on our own to caulk around windows, cover AC units, and to insulate where needed. Be sure to let us know if some areas are not as warm and comfortable as they should be and we will investigate.

You may have noticed that the parking lot work, which simply entailed sealing cracks in the pavement, was completed. Similar repairs to the sidewalks are ongoing near the parking lot. We will also put patches on worn areas around the rest of the property.

In addition, a new dumpster and enclosure are now in place for CMPC use, which will help us maintain a clean facility and property. New recycle bins are now also in place and located around the facility so that all those who use the church can now remove their trash and recyclables more conveniently.

Furthermore, our new cleaning service has started work and is doing a great job. You may recall that this work is now done at night from 10 p.m. – 2 a.m. so if you happen to be here at that time, be sure to say hello and let them know that you are there. They will be happy to work in other areas until you are done, but please ensure that they are able to do so as their time here is short. Of course, let us know if this service can be improved in any way.

Our new landscaper has begun their work here and you likely have noticed much of their work, including the mulched hill and weeded plant beds. Unfortunately, they had to remove a tree out in front of the church that was struggling for light from being too close to other trees, but they are busy preparing a plan to ensure that we maintain the remaining trees to avoid this issue in the future.

Finally, CMPC members and guests have likely noticed the new motion sensors in the restrooms and hallways throughout the church. We also continue to replace bulbs with LEDs or fluorescent bulbs wherever possible. This will certainly help us limit utility and bulb replacement costs and improve lighting.

The property committee always welcomes new members and continues to be grateful for all the work of our current members!

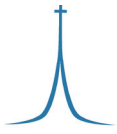

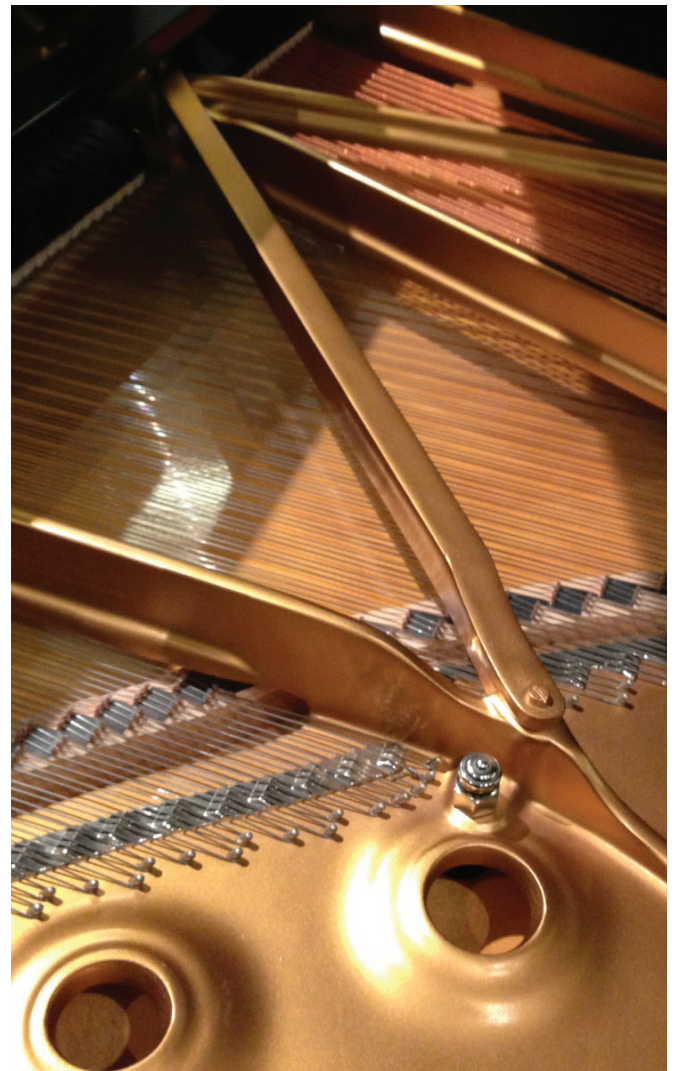

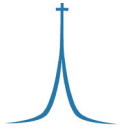

Window On The Word

Jesus Is Our Peace by Leta Renich

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying:

"Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" - Luke 2:13-14 NKJV

Many have misunderstood this message just as the people of Jesus' time misunderstood His mission. The reason is the same for both: His message was supernatural and we live in and interpret things in terms of the natural world. The Messiah's first coming was a supernatural event in the natural world. The people expected the Messiah to overcome the Roman oppressors and rule an earthly kingdom - a natural interpretation. In that light they expected a literal earthly peace. Just as we know that both of these, the earthly kingdom and the literal earthly peace, will be fulfilled when Jesus comes again, we also know that His mission the first time was not the earthly overthrow of the Roman oppressors ([Mat 10:34](#)). His mission was a spiritual mission to free our souls from the bondage of sin by paying the price for our sins. He paid a debt He did not owe, for a debt we could not pay!

"And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" For sometime this has been interpreted as "Peace on earth to men of good will." It is easy to see why, for that is a natural understanding - there is nothing supernatural about men of good will having peace with one another. So what is the supernatural understanding of the angel's message? The best place to find an accurate interpretation is in the Bible.

"He was chosen before the creation of the world, but was revealed in these last times for your sake" ([1 Pet 1:20](#) NIV).

"The word which God sent unto the children of Israel reconciled us to God, thereby making our peace with God and freeing us from the death sentence of our sins" ([Acts 10:36](#) KJV).

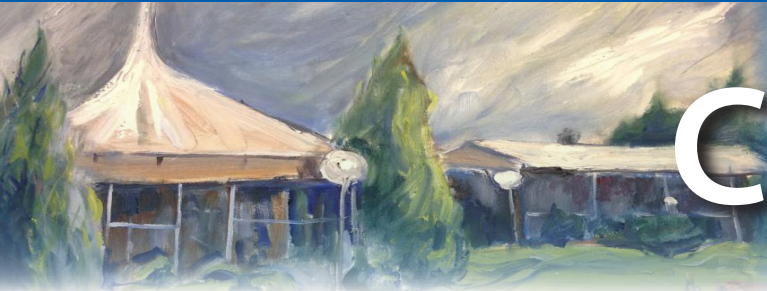
We celebrate Jesus' birth because of this great miracle. God sent His only Son to reconcile us to Him, making peace with Him. Dr. Scofield has given the most concise summary of "peace," noting four references:

1. Peace with God which is the work of Christ reconciling us to God, from whom we are alienated by our sins. This is entered by our faith ([Romans 5:1, 2](#)).
2. Peace from God, the true source of peace ([1 Corinthians 1:3](#) KJV).
3. Peace of God, the quality or nature of the peace given, which is an inward peace ([Phil 4:7](#); [Luke 7:48-50](#); [Phil 4:6-7](#)).
4. Peace "on earth" or the universal peace of the thousand years reign ([Psalm 72:2-8](#); [Psalm 85:8-11](#)).

Jesus knew the people were expecting the Messiah to bring peace on earth and said, "Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I came not to send peace, but a sword" ([Mat 10:34](#) KJV). John records two times Jesus spoke of other meanings of peace: "I am leaving you with a gift-peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give isn't like the peace the world gives. So don't be troubled or afraid" ([John 14:27](#) NLT, [John 16:33](#) KJV).

Further examination reveals that Jesus' peace includes all of the above. The first three are for the individual to experience now. The fourth we will experience in a way that was particularly significant to them at time. The wall that The Law built that separated the Jews from the Gentiles was broken so that the two would worship together as one before the Lord, in peace and unity.

"For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. ([Ephesians 2:14-16](#) NKJV).

How Do The Church Bills Get Paid?

Ever wonder how the church bills get paid? Committee chairs are responsible for managing their budgets. When the committee has work done or asks volunteers to incur expenses for programs, there is a form called an RFP (request for payment) that needs to be filled out and the invoice or receipts are approved by the committee chair. This is sometimes accomplished by e-mailing the information and receipts to the committee chair. Once the approved form with receipts is put in the Treasurer's box or e-mailed to accounting@cmpcusa.org, a check will be prepared the next Monday and after being signed by a second person, mailed out on Wednesday. The forms are available in the church office or on the church website under community: church documents.
