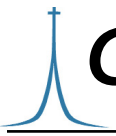

News from the Music Ministry



Thanks and blessings to all the musicians from CMPC who played and sang so capably on Easter Sunday. It was wonderful to see so many of you in the loft singing *Hallelujah!*

Music for worship from the Trinity Choir in May includes *Redeemer*, by Nicole C. Mullen. I have always been struck by the opening words, "Who taught the sun where to stand in the morning? And who told the ocean you can only come this far? And who showed the moon where to hide 'til evening? Whose words alone can catch a falling star?" During the refrain, which repeats in different ways, she says, ". . . I know my Redeemer lives, I know my Redeemer lives; all of creation testifies, this life within me cries, I know my Redeemer lives."

On May 11th, the Word in Music will be *Crown Him (Majesty)* a new setting by Heather Sorenson that includes the congregation. *The Promises of God*, for May 18th, is a contemporary setting of the old hymn favorite *Standing on the Promises*. It has jazzy harmonies and syncopated rhythms that make it a joyous celebration of God's faithfulness. The final anthem in May is an Eastertide anthem titled *Who Is This?* It is an original ballad that begins with these words: "Who is this, crowned in splendor, yet who bends to call me friend?" He is "the King of Glory and of grace."

After June 15th, the choir is on break until September. Please consider offering special music for worship during those weeks. 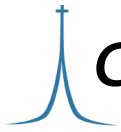

Point your children in the right direction ~ when they're old they won't be lost. -Proverbs 22: 6



Spring has definitely arrived! We have been busy at Christ Memorial Christian Preschool exploring animals, their habitats, and insects. After our Easter break we concentrated on animals that live in the zoo and on a farm. Our art and craft projects revolved around these animals. We visited Sharp's Farm to see farm animals, go on a hay ride, and learn about plants. Our month culminated in learning about pets and insects. Each class has a butterfly habitat. We are learning patience as we watch and wait for the caterpillars to turn into Monarch butterflies. Pet Day was at the end of the month. On this day each child was encouraged to bring in either a favorite stuffed animal or a live pet for Show and Tell. At the end of the day we gathered outside to visit with the larger live pets.

As part of our participation as a Healthy Howard County childcare site, many of our children and their families participated in Screen-free Week. During this week they neither watched TV or DVD's nor played video games. We also rode our tricycles to benefit St. Jude's Research Hospital. Over the last ten events the preschool children have raised over \$24,000 to help sick children.

The Bible stories this month centered on Christ's life on Earth after His resurrection and how we can spread the Good News. Our Bible verse for May is "He has made everything beautiful in its time." Ecclesiastes 3: 11

Registration for the 2014/15 school year is ongoing until all spaces are filled. Registration is \$100 for church members and continuing students and \$125 for all others. For those families registering more than one child there is a 50% discount on the second child's registration fee. Please let your family and friends know about us. Our classes and tuition rates are as follows:

Two-day class ~ (\$141) This class is on Tuesday & Thursday (9 a.m. to noon) and is for children who turn three before September 30th.

Three-day class ~ (\$207) This Monday, Wednesday, Friday class (9 a.m. to noon) is for children who turn four before September 30th.

Five-day class ~ (\$325) This class meets every day (9 a.m. to noon) and is for children who will attend Kindergarten the following school year.

We offer a family discount of 10% off the total monthly tuition for families with more than one child attending the preschool. All children must be potty-trained before school begins. Financial assistance is available.

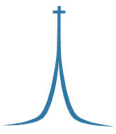

Window on the Word

Heart Transplant

Did you know God has only sons and daughters, and not any grandchildren? Going to church does not make you a Christian any more than going to the garage makes you a mechanic, although in each case you learn a lot about what goes on there as well as the lingo. He requires each one of us to give our life to Him, to belong to Him as He intended in the creation. That means all we are, all our gifts, talents, abilities, skills, and possessions belong to the Lord.

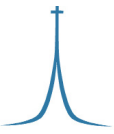
The people of Israel in the OT were taught that a blood sacrifice was required to pay for their sins, so when Christ laid down his life willingly to pay for our sins we would know he was paying the sin price we owe, but could not pay.

If you were to die tonight, do you know where you would wake up? Did you know it is possible to know for certain? I think there will be general agreement that no one is perfect, except Jesus. God is a Holy God, to quote from the New Living translation, "But you are pure and cannot stand the sight of evil." ([Habakkuk 1:13](#)). So where does that leave us?

Being our creator, and loving us as well as planning the end from the beginning, He planned to make a covering over our sins. He sent his son to reveal Himself to us, live a perfect life, then give his life for us that we might be restored to fellowship with God as he had designed it, walking with Adam and Eve in the Garden in the evening. When we are in Christ, God sees Christ's pureness covering us which gives us the rights of his sons and daughters. How awesome!

While we are living on this earth, we have the choice to live our own way, "I am the Captain of my soul," or we may choose to belong to God and live His way. In the parable of the Unjust Steward, Jesus stated, "no servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one, and love the other, or else he will hold to one, and despise the other.

You cannot serve God and mammon.” (Luke 16: 13 NASB)

If our hearts are not right with God, He is longing for us to turn to Him. Repeatedly in the OT, the Hebrew people turned away to other gods and God sent His prophets to them calling them back to the covenant relationship and promising them a New Covenant written on their hearts.

Jeremiah also prophesied that we will know God (Jeremiah 24: 7), indicating His desire for us to know Him. Jesus said that if we know him, we know His Father because He and the Father are the same. This knowing is initiated by God revealing Himself first through the scripture, then through the Christ living on earth as a human.

The New Covenant is Jesus, the Messiah (Christ), who fulfilled all the OT law to institute the New Covenant. John tells us that Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit to bring to their remembrance all things He had said. This is how God writes on our hearts: we must study the Bible so we will know what He has said; and pray for His guidance - ask Him for all our needs (not wants, although He often provides these also in His overflowing love).

“This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws upon their heart, and upon their minds will I write them.” He then says, “and their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more.” (Hebrews 10: 16-17)

Have you had your heart transplant yet? All you need to do is, pray to God, admitting that you have sinned because you cannot meet His requirement of perfection and desire His help. Give your life to Him to use as He pleases.

(He states His purpose in Romans 8: 29, “And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose. For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the first-born among many brethren; and whom He predestined, these He also called; and whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified. (Romans 8: 28-30 NASB).

Moment for Missions



Sunday June 8, 2014, Doug Carl, Director of Emergency and Outreach Services at Grassroots will be presenting the Moment for Missions in our morning worship service.

Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center

The Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center on Freetown Road in Columbia (next to Atholton High School) is 25,000 square feet and houses a 33-bed family and women's shelter, and an 18-bed men's shelter. The on-site, 24-hour crisis intervention services include hotlines and walk-in counseling. A Mobile Crisis Team is also located on-site. Grassroots also implements a Cold Weather Shelter for the homeless in which CMPC and other local churches participate every year. Their goal is to help in guiding people away from homelessness. They provide case workers to help them get back on their feet with job interviews, as well as interview preparation.

Route 1 Day Resource Center

Grassroots coordinates sponsorship with many other local churches, including CMPC, of the Day Center located on Route 1 in Jessup which serves the homeless population who live in the woods and under bridges in the vicinity. They occupy a separate building that provides showers, washers and dryers, hot meals, and use of a computer for job hunting and recreation. The facility is staffed by a manager, social worker, and various volunteers who provide services the three half days of the week the Center is open. The Day Center offers the homeless an opportunity to interact with each other and volunteers who offer fellowship and provide a sense of community which the homeless have identified as their greatest need. The number of people using the Center is steadily increasing with nearly 100 attending on some days. The Day Center grew out of concerned churches wanting to do something to address the problems of the homeless in Howard County.

Rebuilding Together Howard County - April 26, 2014

Fourteen CMPC volunteers repaired an entry door, replaced three sets of closet doors, repaired drop ceiling in one bathroom, painted four bathrooms, spackled numerous holes, scratches, and indentions in walls, painted outside foundation, and loaded four truck loads of debris for delivery to the landfill.

New Door System to be Installed

Soon a new magnetic lock system will be installed on the doors leading in from the parking lot here at CMPC. 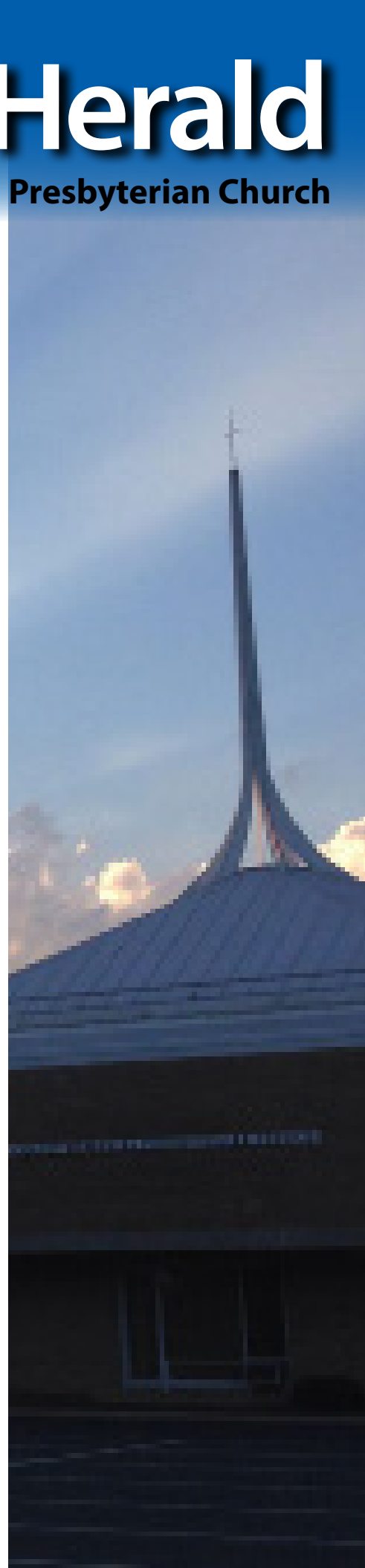
