#### Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, He Lives (also sometimes titled I Serve a Risen Savior) was written by Alfred Ackley. He was born and raised in PA, graduating from Westminster Theological Seminary and ordained as a Presbyterian pastor in 1914. He served churches in PA and CA. He was also a talented musician, studying at the Royal Academy of Music in London (principal instrument was cello.) His wife encouraged him to use his skills to write a song about our risen Savior. After rereading the account of Jesus's resurrection in the gospel of Mark, Ackley wrote the words to this hymn, which was a favorite Easter hymn for many years. The first verse and refrain are: "I serve a risen Savior, He's in the world today; I know that He is living, whatever men may say; I see His hand of mercy, I hear His voice of cheer, and just the time I need Him, He's always near. He lives, He lives, Christ Jesus lives today! He walks with me and talks with me along life's narrow way. He lives, He lives, salvation to impart! You ask me how I know He lives? He lives within my heart."

I remember clearly the first time that I really listened to the opening words of Nicole Mullen's recording of Redeemer (being offered today as a choral arrangement for the Word in Music) and the strong images it brought to mind, along with the reality of how much we take these "events" for granted. They say, "Who taught the sun where to stand in the morning? And who told the ocean 'you can only come this far'? And who showed the moon where to hide 'til evening? Whose words alone can catch a falling star?" During the refrain, which repeats throughout the anthem, Mullen writes, "... I know my Redeemer lives; all of creation testifies, this life within me cries, I know my Redeemer lives."

The composer of the offertory piece, Darlene Zschech, is an Australian Pentecostal Christian worship leader who writes praise and worship songs. Other pieces she has composed that are familiar to many are Shout to the Lord and Mighty to Save. The first lyrics of the song: "Thank you for the cross, Lord. Thank you for the price you paid. Bearing all my sin and shame, in love you came and gave Amazing Grace."
