Worship Music this Week:

The music for the selections for prelude, offertory and postlude, *All Hail the Power (of Jesus' Name*), are taken from a booklet arranged by Janet Linker that contains a series of ten different arrangements. During the Advent, Lent and Easter seasons, much of the choral music focused on His name; i.e., the cantata was *Jesus! The Advent of the Messiah*, and the Easter Word in Music was *Jesus! Scord*.

One of the most dramatic instances of the use of *All Hail the Power* is found in an article about the experience of Reverend E. P. Scott in India. He wanted to evangelize to a tribe that was said to be quite uncivilized. He was urged by friends not to go to where they lived. He went anyway, trusting God to protect him. After a long journey he reached their country among the hills. The tribe immediately surrounded him, threatening him with spears. He had nothing in his hands except his violin. He closed his eyes and began to play and sing, *All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name*. He expected to be killed instantly. But when he opened his eyes, the natives had dropped their spears and were open to receiving him, first with curiosity, and then with eagerness, as he told them the gospel story. They became Christians!

The Word in Music, Lord of the Dance, is a hymn text written by English songwriter Sydney Carter in 1963. He used an American Shaker tune, Simple Gifts, as the music for the piece. It follows the format of a traditional English carol, Tomorrow Will Be My Dancing Day, which tells the gospel story in the first person voice of Jesus that portrays His life and mission as a dance. Carter's song Lord of the Dance follows the same premise. Carter said of this hymn, "I see Christ as the incarnation of the piper who is calling us. He dances that shape and pattern which is at the heart of our reality. By Christ I mean not only Jesus; in other times and places, other planets, there may be other Lords of the Dance. But Jesus is the one I know of first and best. I sing of the dancing pattern in the life and words of Jesus." (From Green Print for Song, Stainer and Bell, 1974 and Lord of the Dance and other Songs and Poems, Stainer and Bell, 2002.)
