Worship Music this Week:

The words for the prelude piece, *When in Our Music God Is Glorified*, were written by Fred Green in 1972 (music composed by Charles Stanford in 1904) for occasions celebrating music. The text speaks about how human song gives voice to creation, how music can convey new insight, how sung faith has kept the church authentic, how Jesus relied on the psalms, and how sound can be praise (info from the Glory to God hymnal.)

Today the Trinity Choir will offer three anthems during worship, on their last Sunday to sing as a group until September. Many of the anthems, as well as the Christmas cantata, Jesus, The Advent of the Messiah, this season have focused on Jesus, i.e., His name, His love, and His forgiveness.

The Word in Music, Jesus Is the Friend Who's Always There (sung on October 22, 2017), is written in southern gospel style. It includes the familiar tune What a Friend We Have in Jesus in an arrangement that is syncopated and up-tempo, that also includes original words and music. The song reminds us of the assurance of Christ's presence in our lives.

Jesus Is Lord, was the Easter anthem (April 1, 2018.) The writing team of Keith Getty and Stuart Townend composed it in 2003. It is a very powerful song that begins this way: "Jesus is Lord!' the cry that echoes through creation: resplendent pow'r, eternal Word, our rock. The Son of God, the King whose glory fills the heavens . . ." and goes on to say, "Jesus is Lord, the tomb is gloriously empty! Not even death could crush this King of love! The price is paid, the chains are loosed, and we're forgiven, and we can run into the arms of God."

Jesus, Only Jesus is an anthem that was sung on November 26, 2017, which was Christ the King Sunday. Written by several well-known musicians, including Matt Redman and Chris Tomlin, the lyrics ask a series of questions; i.e., "Who has the power to raise the dead? Who can save us from our sin?" and "Who can make the blind to see? Who holds the keys that set us free?" The response is always "Jesus, only Jesus!"
