Worship Music this Week:
The text and music for the Word in Music for this Trinity Sunday, *Sovereign God, Our Great Creator*, reflect our relationship with the Triune God. Passages throughout the anthem call Him "our great Creator", "our great Redeemer", and "our great Sustainer", prior to the final words, referenced previously.

The person who is usually given the credit for the hymn *Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!* is John Dykes, who wrote the music (hymn tune *Nicaea*) in 1861 for the text that Reginald Heber penned in 1827, who wrote it specifically for Trinity Sunday. After serving many years as a parish priest in the Anglican church, Heber moved to India to become the bishop of Calcutta. The arrangement for the offertory this morning is very different - it is quiet, unlike when they hymn is sung - always with boldness.
