Worship Music this Week:

The opening hymn this morning, *Praise Ye the Lord, the Almighty*, is based on Joachim Neander's German hymn *Lobe den Herren, den mächtigen König der Ehren*, published in 1680. Catherine Winkworth published her English translation of Neander's hymn in 1863.

The Word in Music, Here I Am to Worship, was composed by Tim Hughes in 1999 as a response to how he felt after reading the second chapter of Philippians. In an interview with Christianity magazine, Hughes said, "I wrote this song when I was studying at university in Sheffield. I'd been reading about the life of Jesus, and about us imitating Christ's humility and the fact that Jesus gave up everything, walked upon the earth and was obedient even to death on a cross."

He says that he began to worship in response to reading the Philippians passage. He began the song with the words, "Light of the world, you stepped down into darkness, opened my eyes, let me see." And he wrote the tag words, "I'll never know how much it cost to see my sin upon that cross." But he could not finish the song with a chorus to his liking.

About six months later he went to see *The Green Mile*, a Stephen King movie about substitution; someone taking on a punishment that wasn't rightfully his to take. He said that the themes of the cross and sacrifice were so powerful, that he began to sing the song again and decided he would finish composing it. He started to listen to old tapes of melodic ideas he had written earlier. When he came across something that spoke to him, he quickly wrote the rest of the lyrics. The verses of the song speak about what Jesus has done. The chorus, he felt, needed to be a simple. He said he was thinking, "Well, I'm going to respond by worshipping you, bowing down, and saying that you're my God."The song was released in 2001 by ThankYou Music.

Lloyd Larson, the arranger of the anthem today, incorporates the opening and closing lines of the first verse of *Holy! Holy! Lord God Almighty!* within the piece.
