Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, *I Worship You, Almighty God*, is one of the songs that is included in the choral anthem today, written by Sondra Corbett-Wood. She composed the piece in 1983.

The hymn after the sermon, *Be Thou My Vision*, is an ancient Irish poem translated into English by Mary Byrne in 1905. It is an anonymous tune that comes from the 7th or 8th century. The word "vision" is used to indicate not only what we focus on, but also what we strive for. The hymn is the anthem of Delbarton School, a Benedictine school in Northern New Jersey, and can often be heard ringing from the bell tower there.

The offertory, We Fall Down, was composed by Chris Tomlin, first released in 2001. When he wrote it, he was traveling and helping to lead worship with Louie Giglio, who started the "Passion" movement, which eventually gave Tomlin and his songs a national platform. Each night of the tour, Giglio would talk about a different aspect of books of the Bible. One week he was preaching on Revelation chapter 4. In a Crosswalk.com interview, Tomlin said, "It was a revelation to John of what was going on around the throne of God and it said these living creatures ... day and night they never stop saying, holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come. I was hearing that each night and was just blown away by the thought that they never cease ... and that must be an amazing sight." He says he was so moved by the image, he went back to his hotel room, sat on the edge of the bed and wrote what he refers to as "just a little simple song." He took it to Giglio's room for feedback, who told him that the whole world would sing that song eventually. And as Tomlin became well-known and traveled to many countries, We Fall Down is a song that audiences knew, and sang, around the world. The text of the song: "We fall down, we lay our crowns at the feet of Jesus, the greatness of mercy and love at the feet of Jesus. And we cry holy, holy, holy, we cry holy, holy,
