Worship Music this Week: World Communion Sunday

The prelude, *Tell the Nations*, is an instrumental arrangement of two old hymns, *We've a Story to Tell to the Nations*, written by H. Ernest Nichol in 1896, and *O Zion Haste*, written by Mary Ann Thomson in 1868. Both hymns have a message of His call for us to tell all the people of the world about our Savior, Jesus Christ. The text for verse 1 and chorus of the song says, "We've a story to tell to the nations, that shall turn their hearts to the right; a story of truth and mercy, a story of peace and light, a story of peace and light. For the darkness shall turn to dawning, and the dawning to noonday bright, and Christ's great kingdom shall come on earth, the kingdom of love and light." The ensuing verses have words that begin with, "We've a message to give to the nations," and "We've a Savior to show to the nations." The second song in the arrangement says, "O Zion, haste, thy mission high fulfilling, to tell to all the world that God is Light; that He who made all nations is not willing one soul should perish, lost in shades of night. Publish glad tidings, tidings of peace, tidings of Jesus, redemption, and release."

The text for the offertory piece, Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ, was written in 1975 by Fred Kaan, who calls it a "communion calypso." He used the music to a Jamaican folk melody. He was born in Haarlem in the Netherlands in 1929. Kaan lived through the Nazi occupation, watching three of his grandparents die of starvation. His parents were deeply involved in the resistance movement, taking in many refugees. He, too, became a pacifist. Eventually (in 1955) he was ordained, and began to write hymns in the mid-1960s.

The first communion song, Amazing Love, was written by Graham Kendrick in 1989 (Make Way Music). The refrain: "Amazing love, O what sacrifice; the Son of God given for me. My debt he pays, and my death he dies; that I might live, that I might live!"

The second offering during communion, You Are My King (Amazing Love), was written in 1999 by Billy James Foote (Worship Together Music.) The text: "My Lord what love is this that pays so dearly, that I, the guilty one may go free. Amazing love, oh what sacrifice. The Son of God given for me; my debt He pays and my death He dies; that I might live."
