### What's a Prayer Shawl?

A knit or crocheted wrap for a recipient who could use prayers of comfort, peace, strength, encouragement, or blessings. Usually stitched in a Trinity stitch (combination of 3), the shawl maker begins by choosing a beautiful selection of donated yarn. Occasionally, the maker may know who the shawl is for as they are making it. Other times shawls are made, a need arises, and then a choice is made from the available completed shawls. Each shawl when completed is prayed over before it is lovingly packaged and sent to its recipient with blessings.

Can you knit or crochet? Would you like to learn or possibly you remember some stitches but could use some coaching? The Prayer Shawl Ministry at CMPC could use your help. This ministry is currently meeting on Thursday mornings at Barb Schmehl's (6713 Seneca Drive, Columbia) from 10:00-11:30 am while CMPC is being renovated.
