Worship Music this Week:

The "Noel" in the title of the prelude is a French word that may come from either the Latin natilis, meaning "birth," or from the Latin Novella, meaning "new." Noel can be applied to the whole Advent/Christmas season, referring to the good news that Jesus will come and has come. Early folk carols like this one usually had many stanzas, each telling part of the story (usually sung by a leader), and a chorus that everyone would sing. The chorus for this carol begins with "Noel, Noel...".

The background for the Word in Music, Fling Wide the Door, is a popular German Advent hymn, composed by Ducal Prussia in the 17th century. Georg Wiessel penned the lyrics in 1623. Macht hoch die Tür translates to "make high the doors" in English. The message: "The King of glory comes!"

While Shepherd Watched Their Flocks (the postlude) is a paraphrase of the shepherds' story as found in Luke 2: 8-14: And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."
