Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming, is a Christmas carol of German origin. It may go back as far as the fourteenth century. Isaiah 11:1 tells of a shoot coming up from the stump of Jesse. The first verse says, "Lo, how a Rose e'er blooming from tender stem hath sprung! Of Jesse's lineage coming as men of old have sung. It came, a flower bright, Amid the cold of winter when half-gone was the night."

Get Ready for the King, the Word in Music, is an African Advent Carol. Part of the wonder of the Advent and Christmas season is the anticipation of the coming of Jesus. In this anthem, the growing expectation is wonderfully captured by composer Michael Barrett. A guote of the traditional spiritual Kum Ba Yah (meaning "come by here") is part of the arrangement.

The text for the closing hymn, Come, Though Long-Expected Jesus, was written by Charles Wesley in 1744 (music by Rowland Prichard, 1830.) Wesley's words express longing for the arrival of our savior - a prayer that implores Christ to be among us. In the hymn, he speaks of Christ as the "desire of every nation" and the "joy of every longing heart."
