Lincoln Brewster, one of the composers for the prelude offering, said that he based the bridge for No One Like Our God on Romans 8: 38-39. The bridge words are: "No height or depth can stand between us; no power on earth or all creation; no life or death can separate us from Your love." Brewster is a senior pastor at Bayside Church near Sacramento, CA.

The text for the opening hymn, Great Is Thy Faithfulness, was written by Thomas Chisholm. He was born in a log cabin in Kentucky in 1866. He began working as a school teacher at age 16, although he himself had no high school or college education. He was a Methodist minister for a few years, but had to resign due to poor health. He wrote more than 1200 poems. In 1923 he sent several to William Runyan (the composer of this hymn tune) who later wrote, "This particular poem held such an appeal that I prayed most earnestly that my tune might carry over its message in a worthy way, and the subsequent history of its use indicates that God answered prayer." The hymn was first introduced in Great Britain in 1954 by the Billy Graham Crusades.

The Word in Music, Raise Your Hands, is a profound message of faith that reminds us that we can call on our Lord in every situation in life. See the insert for the text of Heather Sorenson's beautiful anthem.

You Raise Me Up, the offertory piano solo, was composed by an Irish-Norwegian duo known as Secret Garden. The song was originally written as an instrumental piece, with parts of the melody drawing on inspiration from Londonderry Air, the tune used for Danny Boy. The song was brought to the United States in 2003 and performed by Josh Groban, who states that it is God who raises him up.


