Worship Music this Week:
How Majestic Is Your Name, the prelude, was composed by Christian artist Michael W. Smith in 1981 and first recorded by Sandy Patti. The song will also be heard during one section of today's Word in Music. The majority of the anthem, *Mighty Is Our God*, was composed by several people, including Don Moen, in 1989.

The offertory piano solo, *Great Is the Lord*, was composed by Michael W Smith and his wife, Deborah Smith in 1982. The words to the first verse and refrain: "Great is the Lord, He is holy and just; by His power we trust in His love. Great is the Lord, He is faithful and true; by His mercy He proves He is love. Great is the Lord and worthy of glory! Great is the Lord and worthy of praise. Great is the Lord; now lift up your voice, now lift up your voice; great is the Lord! Great is the Lord!" Lord of the Dance, the postlude offering, is a hymn with words written by English songwriter Sydney Carter in 1963. The hymn is in our current hymnal (#157) under the title *I Danced in the Morning*. Carter borrowed the tune for the hymn from the American Shaker song, *Simple Gifts*. The song has many similarities to the pre-reformation carol *Tomorrow Will Be My Dancing Day*, which tells the gospel story in the first-person voice of Jesus.
