Worship Music this Week

The Word in Music is a combination of a praise song written by Reuben Morgan in 1995 and a song composed by Harry Clarke in 1924. The first part, I Give You My Heart, was written when Morgan moved to Sydney, Australia to study at the Institute of Music, where he wrote the song. One week prior to going on a ministry trip with friends, he was in a serious car accident. He said the incident reminded him of how fragile and uncertain life is. During his recovery, this song began to take shape. Morgan says in an interview published on Crosswalk.com: "I was writing and playing around with a melodic idea that I had been working on and it was like, just for a moment, I tapped into this deeper well and I was singing 'Lord I give You my heart, I give You my soul...' over and over. It's a prayer I had been praying for a while and it all just fit together, one of those songs that seemed to write itself."

Did you sing Into My Heart (the second song contained within the Lloyd Larson choral arrangement) in Sunday School? It is definitely one of the songs that I sang during song time growing up. In doing research for the piece, I came across a second verse that I was unaware of. The words are nice to know (and perhaps sing) as well. Written anonymously, they say: "Out of my heart, out of my heart, shine out of my heart, Lord Jesus; shine out today, shine out alway; shine out of my heart, Lord Jesus." (Hope Publishing Company, 1952)

Paul Baloche, the composer of the offertory piece, Open the Eyes of My Heart, based the song on the Bible verse printed with the title above. The song had its beginning when Baloche heard his pastor opening his prayers with the request, "Open the eyes of our hearts, Lord, that we may see you." He has said that he recognized the wisdom of this request and turned that prayer into a song.


