The prelude is a combination of two songs. The first is Commune With Me, written by Kirk Dearman in 2007, which simply talks about being with each other to worship. The second (and one of the hymns during worship today) is Let Us Break Bread Together, an African American spiritual created by slaves in America during the late eighteenth or early nineteenth century and passed along orally. The first time it was recorded and printed was in a book published in 1927 by James Weldon Johnson, a poet and song writer.

From an article written by Robert Cottrill in Wordwise Hymns in 2014: "When these words were sung, it was a secret signal of southern slaves (possibly in Virginia) to convene a meeting for worship. This was done, rather than using traditional drums for the purpose, which were forbidden by state law. Even the assembling of slaves to hold a church service was looked upon with suspicion." Cottrill further states that it is believed that the words "the rising son" in the hymn symbolize a search for spiritual light and a longing and hope for a new day of freedom to dawn.

The Word in Music, Come Share the Lord, is a choral arrangement of a hymn written by Bryan Jeffrey Leech in 1984. It is also one of the hymns (#510) in our hymnal. Mr. Leech received his education at The London Bible College in England, at Barrington College in Massachusetts, and at North Park Seminary in Chicago. He was ordained in 1959 in the Evangelical Covenant denomination, and has served pastorates in Massachusetts, New Jersey and California. Today he is the pastor emeritus at First Covenant Church in Oakland, Calif. He has composed over 500 songs, hymns, anthems and cantatas.
