The tune for the prelude, Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross, was written first by William H. Doane; then the words were added by Fanny Crosby in 1869. The subject she chose for the text was the cross of Christ. She realized that, without the cross, there is no salvation, no eternal life, no hope. The first verse and refrain are: "Jesus, keep me near the cross, there a precious fountain; free to all, a healing stream, flows from Calv'ry's mountain. In the cross, in the cross, be my glory ever; 'til my ransomed soul shall find rest beyond the river." (Public Domain)

The opening hymn, Blessed Jesus, at Your Word, is a gathering hymn that the author hoped would bring believers out of the murky world and into the presence of our Lord. The text was composed by Tobias Clausnitzer in 1663 and translated by Catherine Winkworth in 1858.

The Old Rugged Cross that you will hear for the Word in Music and the postlude was composed by George Bennard in 1913. He served in the Salvation Army before he was ordained in the Methodist Episcopal Church. After his ordination, he led revivals throughout the Midwest. He wrote the melody first, but was not satisfied with the words that he put to the song. The words of the hymn that we sing today he says, "were put into my heart in answer to my own need."
