Worship Music this Week:

The text for the prelude, What Wondrous Love Is This, began as a folk hymn that was passed down from one generation to another. The origins and text of the song are not known and were probably changed over time. Folk songs usually consist of the repetition of key phrases, to aid in learning the song, which is passed down orally. In the first verse, the words "Oh my soul" and "for my soul" are the repeated words. The text was first published in 1811, and set to music in 1835. Words to the first verse: "What wondrous love is this, O my soul, O my soul! What wondrous love is this, O my soul! What wondrous love is this that caused the Lord of bliss; to bear the dreadful curse for my soul, for my soul; to bear the dreadful curse for my soul." (Public Domain)

The Word in Music, I Will Boast, and offertory piano solo, At the Cross, are both songs from Chris Tomlin's Love Ran Red album. In an interview with Crosswalk, Tomlin talked about how the songs included on the CD gave him a new perspective on the Gospel story of Jesus – about Him giving up His life for ours on a cross, making payment for all the wrong things we have done. The title song describes what happened to Jesus and what happened to our sin. Tomlin said, "You think you've sung every way to sing about the cross, and then a line like this comes along and you just see it all brand new again." The words he is referring to are: "At the cross, at the cross I surrender my life, I'm in awe of You, I'm in awe of You. Where Your love ran red and my sin washed white, I owe all to You, I owe all to You, Jesus." (by Tomlin /Ingram; Warner/Chappell Music, Inc., 2014)
