Worship Music this Week:

When William Doane, a Cincinnati businessman who liked composing gospel music, asked Fanny Crosby to write lyrics for music he wanted to compose for the prelude tune, it took a few weeks for her to write words that she felt would be meaningful. Usually Crosby, who was blind, penned lyrics very quickly. The only guidance he gave her was that the lyrics should begin with "Pass me not, O gentle Savior", the title for the prelude this morning. Doane later wrote that the inspiration for the hymn was the result of a visit to a prison by Crosby during the spring of 1868. He noted that after she had spoken and some of her hymns had been sung, she heard one of the prisoners cry out in a pleading voice, "Good Lord, do not pass me by!" After the visit, she wrote the hymn lyrics, incorporating the line he had suggested. The arrangement by Mary McDonald begins slowly, then becomes a lively gospel style.

The Word in Music, Wonderful Songs of Grace, is a medley of hymns that articulate the virtues of God's never-ending grace. Included in the choral arrangement by Joseph Martin are Grace Greater Than Our Sin, Amazing Grace, At Calvary and Wonderful Grace of Jesus.

The offertory piano solo incorporates two songs, Lord Have Mercy and At Calvary (written by William Newell in 1895.) The beginning song of the arrangement words are: "Jesus, I've forgotten the words that You have spoken; promises that burned within my heart have now grown dim. With a doubting heart I follow the paths of earthly wisdom; forgive me for my unbelief, renew the fire again. Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy on me" (M. Coeuriot /M. Jonasz, Sony/ATV Music Publishing LLC, 1982)


