Worship Music this Week:

The opening hymn this morning, When Morning Gilds the Skies, is of German origin, composed by an unknown author in 1828. The composition had 14 verses. When Edward Caswall translated it into English in 1853, he shortened it considerably. The tune, Laudes Domini was written by Joseph Barnby specifically for this text. The hymn calls on us to praise God at all times, day or night . . . "through all the ages long. May Jesus Christ be praised!"

The Word in Music, Joy Down in My Heart, is an upbeat gospel medley that combines Charles Gabriel's Since Jesus Came into My Heart with the beloved Sunday school song I've Got the Joy (joy, joy, joy down in my heart – down in my heart to stay).

The composer of the offertory piece, Change My Heart, Oh God, said in an interview in 2016 that when he wrote it, he was feeling busy and overwhelmed. He realized as he prayed that his heart needed to be changed so that God would be first in his life again. Eddie said, "Shortly thereafter I was in my car on the way to my work, feeling a desire to draw near to God. Suddenly, a melody and some words began to flood through my mind. As I stopped at a stop sign I reached for something to write on. The first thing I found was a small piece of yellow paper, which, by the way, I still have, and began to write as rapidly as I could. It was like taking dictation. I wrote the words on the paper, and kept the melody in my mind."The words: "Change my heart oh God, make it ever true. Change my heart oh God, may I be like You. You are the potter, I am the clay; mold me and make me, this is what I pray. Change my heart oh God, may I be like You." (Eddie Espinosa; Mercy/Vineyard Publishing, 1982)


