Worship Music this Week:

The text for the Word in Music, For Everyone Born, was written in 1998 by Author: Shirley Erena Murray (music composed by Brian Mann in 2006.) The author is from New Zealand and has worked with people the world over writing hymns. The text to the song affirms that God's hospitality transcends the barriers erected by human society and that we who have been created in God's image are called to live in ways that reflect our Creator's values: justice and joy, compassion and peace (from Glory to God.)

In an interview (author anonymous) Ms. Murray wrote the following about her reasons for writing this hymn: "...I couldn't find anything to reflect a broad overview of human rights in any hymnbook. You can see that I have used some of the very basic ideas of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights - the right to shelter, safety, food, and later, the right to a job, to freedom of speech and worship. I've tried to put them in a context which relates directly to the Gospel, but without excluding those who are not of the Christian faith."
