Worship Music this Week:

The prelude is a combination of two songs. The first, Every Time I Feel the Spirit, is an African American spiritual that was passed down generation to generation. The date that it was finally written down is unknown. The words: "Every time I feel the Spirit, moving in my heart I will pray. Yes, every time I feel the Spirit, moving in my heart I will pray. Upon the mountain, when my Lord spoke, out of God's mouth came fire and smoke. Looked all around me, it looked so fine, till I asked my Lord if all was mine. Every time . . . etc." (Public Domain) The second tune, I'm Gonna Sing When the Spirit Says Sing, is also a spiritual (also public domain) that says: "I'm gonna sing when the Spirit says sing, I'm gonna sing when the Spirit says sing, I'm gonna pray when the Spirit says pray"; and "I'm gonna shout when the Spirit says shout."

The Word in Music, *The Flame*, is a celebration of Pentecost that is very creative. The piece has a constantly changing time signature. The words speak of the Holy Spirit "burning with a love divine; tongues of fire shattered darkness when You came." The text that appears a couple times during the anthem says: "Like a moth drawn to the candle, Spirit, draw me to Your fire. Lift my wings and let me fly, lift my wings and let me fly, closer to the flame."

The text for *Spirit of God, Descend upon My Heart* was written by George Croly (tune by Frederick Atkinson.) Croly was an Anglican minister from Dublin, who went to London as a young man to serve a small congregation. After serving there for twenty-five years, he was asked to re-open Saint Stephens Church in one of London's worst slums. He did so, and had a thriving ministry in that location for more than two decades. It was while working there that Croly wrote this hymn. It is a prayer for God to change us from the inside out; to teach us how to love God, to allow us to seek God and to find Him, to teach us that He is always with us, and to teach us to love as the angels love. His words are in our hymnal (#688.) It is said that the hymn reflects his conviction that redemption is an "inside job" - that it begins not when our surroundings change, but when God changes our heart.

The text for the closing hymn today, You Servants of God, Your Master Proclaim, was written by Charles Wesley in 1744. He was the youngest son and 18th child of Samuel and Susanna Wesley. As a hymn-writer Charles Wesley was unique. He is said to have written no less than 6500 hymns (there are fourteen in our hymnal.) His feelings on every occasion of importance, whether private or public, found their best expression in a hymn.
