#### Worship Music this Week:

The prelude, Blessed Be Your Name, is from the album Where Angels Fear to Tread, sung by Matt Redman. The words: "Blessed Be Your Name in the land that is plentiful, where Your streams of abundance flow, blessed be Your name. Blessed Be Your name when I'm found in the desert place, though I walk through the wilderness blessed Be Your name. Every blessing You pour out, I'll turn back to praise. When the darkness closes in, Lord, still I will say, blessed be the name of the Lord, blessed be Your name; Blessed be the name of the Lord, blessed be Your glorious name!" (Thankyou Music, 2002)

The text for the first hymn, Rejoice, Ye Pure in Heart was written by Edward Plumptre in 1865 for a choir festival at Petersborough Cathedral in England. The song originally had 11 verses, to allow all the choirs to enter the worship space. Plumptre based the hymn on Philippians 4: 4: Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! The tune we use today is Marion, composed by Arthur Messiter in 1883. Marion was his wife's name. Messiter also added the refrain at that time, making the hymn celebratory.

The Word in Music, Find Me At the Feet of Jesus, was composed by several people whose songs we use with some frequency (see above.) It was recorded by Christy Nockels for her Let It Be Jesus album. It is a fervent prayer about how we long to be close to our Lord. The words "find me with my heart bowed down" are particularly poignant.
