#### Worship Music this Week:

The Word in Music today, One World, One Communion, is a song that celebrates the unity of sharing the act of breaking bread and drinking wine with all believers worldwide, proclaiming, "there is room for everyone."

The offertory piece is a solo piano arrangement of a communion hymn by Billema Kwillia, a Liberian convert to Christianity and a literacy teacher-evangelist in that country. He penned verses 1-3 in the 1960s; Margaret Miller translated the song into English in 1969, and Gilbert Dean wrote verse 4 in 1978. Come, Let Us Eat is in our current hymnal (#528.) Stanzas 1 and 2 issue the invitation, "Come, let us eat" and "Come, let us drink"; stanza 3 draws us into the Lord's presence, and stanza 4 dismisses us with the reminder to "spread abroad God's mighty Word." The text for verses 3 and 4 are: "In Jesus' presence now we meet and rest; in the presence of our Lord we gather" and "Rise, then to spread abroad God's mighty word; Jesus Risen will bring in the kingdom." (verses 1-3 copyright: The Lutheran World Federation, 1970; verse 4 copyright: Augsburg Fortress, 1972) It is those verses that most apply to World Communion Sunday.
