Worship Music this Week:

The arrangement for the prelude, We Gather, We Praise, includes two familiar Thanksgiving hymn tunes, We Praise You, O God (We Gather Together in our current hymnal), and Sing to the Lord of Harvest (We Come as Guests Invited in our hymnal.) The first verse of We Praise You is: "We praise you, O God, our Redeemer, Creator; in grateful devotion our tribute we bring. We lay it before you; we kneel and adore you; we bless your holy name; glad praises we sing." (Julia C. Cory, 1902; Public Domain) The first verse of Sing to the Lord is "Sing to the Lord of harvest, sing songs of love and praise; with joyful hearts and voices Your alleluias raise. By Him the rolling seasons in fruitful order move; sing to the Lord of harvest, a joyous song of love." (John S. B. Monsell, 1866; Public Domain)

The Word in Music, We Come to Say Thank You, is very enthusiastic in its expression of gratitude to our loving God. The composer, Pepper Choplin, wrote a new tune for the words to For the Beauty of the Earth (by F. Pierpoint, 1864) that is a part of the arrangement.

The hymn after the sermon, Amazing Love, is a subtitle for a worship song written by Billy James Foote in 1995. After he graduated from East Texas Baptist University in 1990, he started leading worship. At first it was just him on his guitar. Then he added a bass player and a drummer, then a vocalist, his wife, Cindy. When he began to write music, this is one of the songs he composed. The original title was You Are My King with Amazing Love in parentheses. It has been recorded by several groups and solo singers, including Hillsong, Christy Nockels, Newsboys, and Chris Tomlin. The chorus uses lyrics and the some of the melody from Charles Wesley's hymn, And Can It Be (written in 1738.).

Advent GIFT

The Christian Education Committee's Advent GIFT (Generations In Faith Together) will be done at home and also in community through a Facebook Group ("CMPC's Advent at Home in Community"). This is a Closed Group which means that others can see that there is a group but cannot see who a member is or what is posted. You need to request to join. To celebrate the Advent season, we are providing supplies for households of all ages to create Home Faith Jars, beginning December 1. Pick up your jar and packet at church that includes 48 practices that can be rotated through daily, weekly or sporadically. There are 12 mindfulness practices, 12 prayer practices, 12 gratitude practices and 12 questions that lead to a discussion about God.

Decide when you will go through the practices. Some times that seem to work: at dinner, before bed, once a week (like a Saturday morning). You'll take turns selecting a practice from the jar, reading it, and answering the question or doing what the card suggests. Take pictures of your Faith Jar and/or doing some of your activities and then share them on our Facebook Group so we can have the community experience for Advent too.
