The Word in Music today is the first of two anthems that have the same title, *Joy of Every Longing Heart*. The choir will offer the second one during worship next week. They are arranged by different people, and are meant as preludes to the Christmas cantata, *Joy Has Dawned*, which will be offered on December 22nd

2:00 Urdu Worship, FH

The anthem today, arranged by Lloyd Larson, is a mixture of the Advent carol, Of the Father's Love Begotten and J.S. Bach's Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring. Larson keeps the text for Of the Father's Love (Divine Mysterium), (written first during the 4th century and translated by J.M. Neale in 1854), throughout most of the piece, while the accompaniment mainly follows the Jesu track. The arranger also composed some music of his own within the anthem.

The offertory piece has had a few different titles in different publications over the years. The most recent one in a Presbyterian Book was in the old blue hymnal, *Prepare the Way (of Zion)*. A date of composition could not be ascertained. The composer was Frans Mikael Franzen, who lived from 1771-1847. The first verse and refrain are: "Prepare the royal highway, the King of kings is near; let every hill and valley a level road appear. Then greet the king of glory foretold in sacred story; O blest is he that came in God the Father's name! (Publication Right: Lutheran Book of Worship)

Advent GIFT

The Christian Education Committee's Advent GIFT (Generations In Faith Together) will be done at home and also in community through a Facebook Group ("CMPC's Advent at Home in Community"). This is a Closed Group which means that others can see that there is a group but cannot see who a member is or what is posted. You need to request to join. To celebrate the Advent season, we are providing supplies for households of all ages to create Home Faith Jars, beginning today. Pick up your jar and packet at church that includes 48 practices that can be rotated through daily, weekly or sporadically. There are 12 mindfulness practices, 12 prayer practices, 12 gratitude practices and 12 questions that lead to a discussion about God.

Decide when you will go through the practices. Some times that seem to work: at dinner, before bed, once a week (like a Saturday morning). You'll take turns selecting a practice from the jar, reading it, and answering the question or doing what the card suggests. Take pictures of your Faith Jar and/or doing some of your activities and then share them on our Facebook Group so we can have the community experience for Advent too.
