Worship Music this Week:

The piano solo during the offering, *Soon and Very Soon*, was composed by American singer, songwriter, arranger, record producer and pastor Andraé Crouch. The son of pastor parents, he said that he received the gift of music as a child, when his father was called as a guest preacher and pastoral candidate to a small rural church that had no musicians. He began playing for them at the age of 11, wrote his first gospel song at 14, and formed his first band, the COGICS, in 1960. He is sometimes referred to as "the father of modern gospel music." Other compositions include *The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power* and *My Tribute (To God Be the Glory)*. I had the pleasure of meeting him a number of years ago at a PAM (Presbyterian Association of Musician) conference when he directed a gospel choir. Everyone who participated was blessed beyond measure by him! The words: "Soon and very soon we are going to see the king , hallelujah, hallelujah, we're going to see the king! No more crying there, we are going to see the king, hallelujah, hallelujah, we're going to see the king! No more dying there, we are going to see the king; hallelujah, hallelujah, we're going to see the king!" (Bud John Songs, Inc.; Crouch Music; 1976)

The closing hymn today, *God, Be the Love to Search and Keep Me*, is a 21st-century adaptation of the traditional Celtic prayer style known as a lorica (Latin for "armor" or "breastplate"). Many such petitions for God's presence and protection were never written down; however, this one is based on an example attributed to St. Patrick. The text for the hymn was composed by Jeremiah Rankin in 1880, the music by William Tomer in 1880.
