Rebuilding Together Howard County (RTHC)

The annual National Rebuild Workday is April 25, 2020. CMPC has participated each year since 2013. For CMPC to participate we need a Team Leader (House Captain) to organize a team. The duties of House Captain are:

- 1. Attend a monthly meeting during February, March and April.
- 2. Select the house to repair.
- 3. Meet with the owners to discuss the repairs.
- 4. Decide which repairs can be accomplished on the work day and give the owners a list of the repairs to be accomplished.
- 5. Submit list of materials needed to RTHC.
- 6. Recruit volunteers for the work day.
- 7. Organize your work crews.

A meeting will be held after church on Feb 2, 2020 in Classroom 1 to answer questions about RTHC and The National Rebuild Day. Volunteers can be as young as 14 years.
